

WHAT ALMSGIVING REALLY MEANS

The concept of almsgiving goes much deeper than giving money to a worthy cause. Jesus' teachings encourage us to reach out to people in need with our time and talents. Lent gives us the opportunity to cultivate a spirit of generosity, to share what we have and who we are.

LENT'S LITURGICAL SOMBERNESS

We are asked to fast and abstain from rich foods during Lent; so, too, do we give up the *Gloria* and *Alleluia* in the Liturgy. We omit floral decorations and some churches omit instrumental music during these 40 days. In the past crosses and statues were draped in purple cloth throughout Lent.

Lack of the usual joyful elements at the Mass and removing distractions from church interiors was one way to focus our minds on God's call to a deeper interior life with His Son. The more somber and austere atmosphere, the sobriety, the frugality of spirit, helps to purify the soul and focus the mind.


RELICS—People who have been going to Mass for so long, they actually know when to sit, kneel, and stand.
