The Waiting Time

dvent is a time of hope but also a time of waiting. Different than wishing, hope is the belief that, one day, all will be well. Teenagers eagerly wait to be out on their own, believing then all will be well. Students are eager to graduate and get away from papers to write, books to read, and exams to take—then all will be well. Some singles long to find a partner, marry, and settle down, believing—then—all will be well. Always there is the faith that, although life may not now be what we wish, the future will bring a time when all will be well. We are inveterate people of hope.

Yet life is a process that cannot be rushed. Author Annie Dillard once watched a butterfly hatch from a cocoon. A bit impatient, she decided to gently warm

the cocoon and so hasten the process. It worked. except by rushing the process the butterfly's wings were undeveloped, too weak to fly. All that we hope and long for in life must happen at its own pace, faithful to the process.

How, then, do we negotiate the waiting? The Gospel's encouragement is to pray, but not for what we want. Rather, we are to pray for the strength to stand with hope before the Son of Man, trusting that God will bring forth the goodness we need. Though it may be different than what we seek, it will be what we need. •



CANADA, THE KILLING FIELDS OF THE WORLD

Currently, under Canadian law, those who are at least 18 years old and "suffering intolerably" with a medical condition are eligible for MAiD. Our government keeps expanding eligibility, so MAiD has become a slippery slope of horrific outcomes. In eight short years our Supreme Court/legislators have made Canada the killing fields of the world, second only to the Netherlands.

Once those doors to death are opened over a nation, there's a peculiar shift that occurs in the hearts of its people. Cardinal Thomas Collins of Toronto explains: "Just as sometimes callouses grow on the physical body, they can form on the human conscience. And what people were once rightly sensitive to being as wrong, they've come to accept. Familiarity breeds contempt.

And familiarity also allows people to accept what was unacceptable."

ADVENT

The universal Church begins the new liturgical year with the arrival of the season of Advent, a season with two main themes: looking backward and looking forward. In Advent, the Church recalls Christ's identity as Redeemer and Savior as foretold by the prophets — chief among whom is St. John the Baptist. His role was to prepare the people for the first advent of the Messiah, especially through his preaching of repentance and conversion. These are two primary themes of which we should be cognizant as we prepare to meet the Lord when he comes.

Advent has been a part of the Catholic Church calendar since before the year 604 AD as there is evidence of a sermon on that subject by Gregory the Great who died in that year. A Church synod had determined Advent to be observed like the days of Lent. Advent was far more penitential than it is today.

After the Second Vatican Council, emphasis changed from penance to spiritual preparation for Jesus' birth. Even though the Church adopts violet vestments and foregoes the Gloria at mass, our liturgical readings call us to anticipate Jesus' birth, sharing the joy of John the Baptist and the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Advent does not mean "expectation" as some may think. It is a translation of the Greek word "parousia" which means "presence", or more accurately, "arrival" - that is, the beginning ...

In any event the Catholic Encyclopedia tells us Advent is a time when Catholics are admonished to "prepare themselves worthily to celebrate the anniversary of the Lord's coming into the world ..."



TF #429: Pilgrims of Hope - Together in Mission with Fr. Raymond Lafontaine Part

This week on Thinking Faith, we are pleased to conclude our series featuring our recent diocesan gathering with Fr. Raymond Lafontaine, along with a few parting thoughts from our Archbishop Donald Bolen.

Fr. Raymond, a priest from the Archdiocese of Montreal, spent six months with the Archdiocese of Regina starting in May 2024. During his study leave, he visited countless parishes and groups, connecting with priests, pastoral staff, and lay leaders while observing and learning how we "walk together" as a synodal church on mission. Most recently, he participated as a table facilitator at the 2nd Synodal Assembly in Rome in October.

In this series of talks, he shares some of the background leading up to the final gathering in Rome and examines "What did the Spirit speak to the Church through the Synod?" "How far did we progress on the synodal path, and how can we deepen our commitment to walking together in communion, participation, and mission?
