## Blessings of Many Shapes

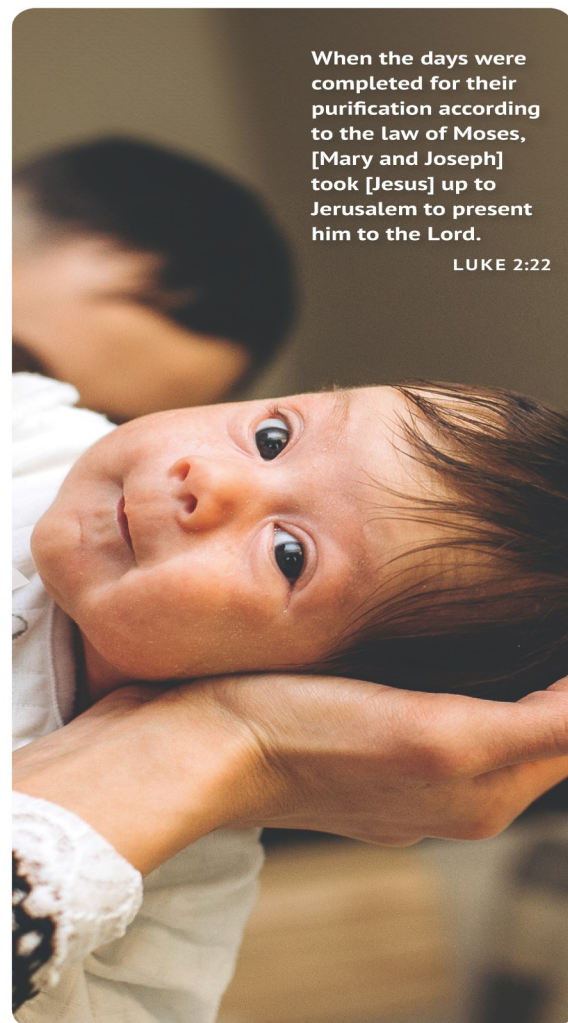

**I**t is always a blessed and holy occasion when parents bring their child to the parish church for baptism. They gather family and friends and proudly present their child to both God and the faith community. Somewhere in the midst of it all, they will wonder who their child will become, what their child's gifts and talents will be, and what hopes and dreams their child will have. Yet like Simeon, who blessed the Holy Family in the Temple, they will also realize that life is not always favorable to us. As Simeon foretold, "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many...and you yourself a sword will pierce" (Luke 2:34-35).

Although we recognize that suffering is a part of everyone's life, and we would never wish it upon a child, we might hope that the child does not run from every suffering, for it becomes the path to wisdom and compassion—perhaps the only path. We might also wish on the child a bit of loneliness, for it teaches us to treasure friends. And amid hoping for the blessing of success, losing can also be a gift and a blessing, for it is how we learn to deal with failure and understand the important lesson that we cannot always have our own way. Failure can be the seed of humility. Fortunately, while doing our best as parents, we must allow God to decide how our children will be blessed and what will nurture their growth into the image of Jesus. We simply present them to God from whom they came. ●

### PRO-LIFE NEWS

A glossary of terms:

**Euthanasia**—The deliberate ending of someone's life, with or without that person's consent, in order to eliminate suffering. The individual who commits euthanasia must, therefore, intend to kill the person and must cause the death, for example, by lethal injection.

**Assisted Suicide**—knowingly and intentionally providing a person with the knowledge or means required to commit suicide, including counselling about lethal doses of drugs, prescribing such lethal drugs or supplying the drugs. Catholic teaching considers assisted suicide or euthanasia unacceptable due to the belief that life is a gift from God, and that we are stewards of this gift, not owners of life. Just as we do not decide the time and circumstances of our births, nor do we decide this of our deaths. To do so impacts the nature of this gift of life both to ourselves and to those around us.

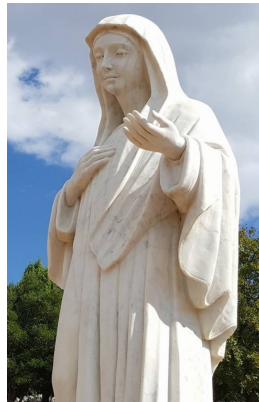
**Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD)** - A Canadian legal term that encompasses both euthanasia and assisted suicide in specific circumstances outlined in the law.

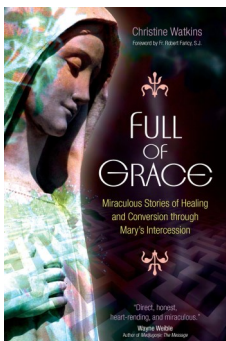

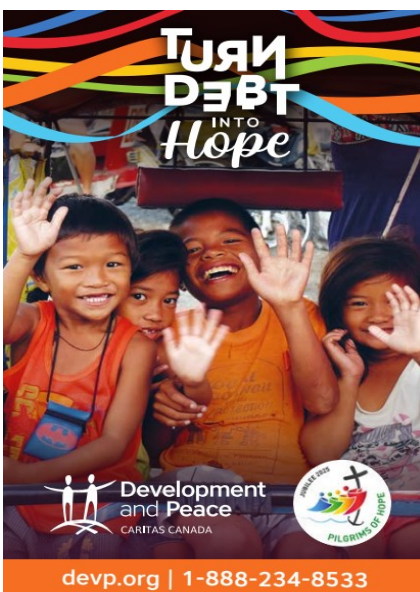

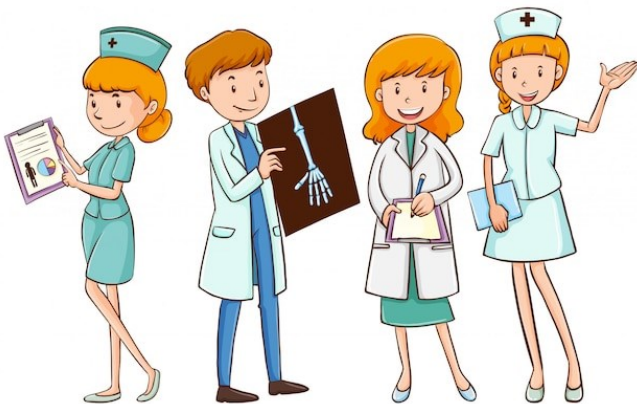

## We Are now celebrating a Jubilee Year in 2025

What did Jubilee mean to our Jewish brethren in the time of Jesus?

The **Jubilee** is the year that follows the passage of seven "weeks of years" This meant seven cycles of sabbatical years("Sabbath of The Land", is the seventh year of the seven-year agricultural cycle mandated by the Torah), or 49 total years. This fiftieth year deals largely with land, property, and property rights. According to regulations found in the Book of Leviticus, certain indentured servants would be released from servitude, some debts would be forgiven, and everyone was supposed to return to their own property in jubilee years.

For Catholics the Year of Jubilee is a biblical concept deeply rooted in Scripture and Tradition, offering the faithful a time of renewal, forgiveness, and celebration. It began on Christmas Eve (December 24), 2024, and ends on January 6, 2026, the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord.
