Calvin and Hobbes comic strip finds Calvin filling water balloons. Immediately, we know there's trouble ahead. Calvin's plan is to drench Susie Derkins unless, as he says, the universe can give him some sign that there is a moral law against it. Calvin gives the universe thirty seconds. When there is no sign, Calvin concludes he is allowed to soak Susie. He finds her and pummels her with water balloons. Susie takes off after Calvin as he runs, screaming, "Help! Help!" The final frame shows Calvin, dazed and beaten, wondering why the universe always gives the sign after you do something.

It does seem that we learn more about the ways of life from our mistakes and upheavals than we do from the times when life unfolds smoothly. It is how we come to wisdom—the wisdom that is the very aura of God present in our lives. In fact, John's Gospel

points out that God is always the one who brings us to that wisdom; a God woven into the very ups and downs of what we are about. "When he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth" (John 16:13). It is St. Paul who notices how the troubles of life are always the source of new wisdom. He writes of how our afflictions lead us to endurance, and how endurance brings about character, and how it is our character (our inner values) that brings us to hope and trust in God's wisdom rather than in our own. In so many ways, it is the power and presence of the Holy Trinity making us new.



## Parish Scam Alert: Fraudulent Information Requests

We've been made aware of a scam currently targeting parishes in which an individual sends an email pretending to be someone known to the parish office (e.g., a staff member, priest, or volunteer). The email may request a copy of the parish directory or other lists in order to access personal contact information.

## **Important Warning Signs:**

The email comes from an address that does not match the official address of the person named. The message may have urgent or vague language asking for help or access to data.

#### What to Do:

Do not respond or provide any information.

Double-check the email address carefully—scammers often use similar-looking domains.

Report the email to your parish office and your IT support or diocesan communications office.

Do not click any links or download attachments from suspicious emails.

Protecting the privacy of our parishioners is critical. Thank you for staying alert and helping keep our communities safe!

## **The Trinity**

*Trinity Sunday* is the first Sunday after Pentecost, instituted to honor the Most Holy Trinity. In the early Church no special Office (an office refers to a duty established by divine or ecclesiastical ordination confirmed for a spiritual purpose) or day was assigned for the Holy Trinity. The Arianian heresy refers to a theological position advanced by Arius, a 3<sup>rd</sup> century month who argued that Jesus Christ, the Son, was not co-eternal or consubstantial with God the Father but was instead a created being, distinct and subordinate. This contradicted the emergency orthodox belief in the Trinity, where the Father, Son and Holy Spirit as one in essence. To respond the Church convened the Council of Nicaea in 325 AD, called by Emperor Constantine, to address this. The result ws the Nicene Creed. Further councils solidified the Trinitarian doctrine. Figures like St Basil the Great and the Cappadocian Fathers played key roles in refuting Arian theology, like creating Offices to be recited on Sundays. John XXII lorded the feast for the entire Church on the first Sunday after Pentecost.
