

Calming Our Storms

he Gospels use images to help us understand the inner journey of our hearts and spirits. This Gospel story of being swamped by a storm is also about the storms of daily living and how they can bring us to faith. "As evening drew on" suggests those times in life when we move into darkness and confusion. These moments may occur when "we cross to the other side" of life-from childhood through adolescence and into adulthood, through sickness until we find healing, from raising a family to being emptynesters, the stress we seek to manage through the upheavals of life-all times when we can feel overwhelmed by what we cannot control.

The Gospel today suggests: 1) Confronted by the question, "Why are you terrified? Do you not have faith?" it submits that it is God who calms our storms and not we ourselves. 2) The Gospel story is more about bringing calm and peace into our stormy inner turmoil than about fixing the outer turmoil with which we may be struggling. 3) The inner calm usually comes at the point of surrender, when we fear the worst because life is beyond our control: "Do you not care that we are perishing?" 4) Though our inner storm grows calm by surrendering to God through faith, the events of our outer storm may continue to be present, yet those events lose their power to overcome us when we accept that God is in control, not us.

Thank You from Martin

Dear Parishioners of Holy Cross,

On behalf of my family, my wife Marie and myself, I say thank you to you all.

Thank you for your support, in all ways, especially your prayers, generous comments, corrections, suggestions and the financial support to the Archbishops' Appeal.

It has been at times a very challenging five years of formation. The learning curve has been sharp and will continue to be steep as I begin my service as a deacon.

You have been a major contributor to my formation all the time I have been here.

When I was hired, I began this wonderful occupation of pastoral assistant and then office assistant. It dovetailed nicely into what I had been doing before as a layperson at Christ the King and in the other parts of my life; serving, instructing, coaching and walking with other people who were trying to live as Catholic Christians, as was I. What I have done and will continue to do, matters.

It matters because we are all walking on our life's salvation journey. That is no small or frivolous task; it is not an add-on to our lives or an amusement, as are so many other choices we make within our days. Sometimes I am able to see the fruits of my actions and words but often not. That is OK.

As I minister "across the desk", a term I've borrowed from Sr. Cora, I try to do so as attentively and with as much purpose as I can. Now I have more "tools" in my tool belt, with the education, graces, gifts and responsibilities of being a deacon.

I am yours, for as long as you want me. My livelihood depends on you having me to continue working for you. Deacons receive no pay for their service and so I continue to appreciate being employed at this parish. What will be somewhat different now is how I serve in the church; how I dress at liturgies, (i.e. funerals) may change – I have an alb hanging in the sacristy (stoles to follow shortly); some of the duties during liturgies may change and how I might participate in other liturgical celebrations may change as well. That has yet to be determined with Fr Carlos. I will be asked to preach to you (at least once and then depending on how well that goes, maybe I will be asked again!). I will continue to be a close part of the Liturgy Committee, the programs and events that Fr. Carlos and you decide to do.

I have been asked how I should now be addressed or what people should call me. If you wish to call me Deacon Martin, please do. It is a salute to my vocation. However, I am Martin, have been Martin and will always be Martin to you all.

I will be happy to address all questions you have concerning what it means to be a deacon. Just ask.

Once again, thank you so very much for your support. I ask for your continued prayers for my family, your ongoing encouragement, and me.
