Socrates, the Spirit, and Self


now thyself," advised the philosopher Socrates. Yet easier said than done. A recent public service ad warning about the dangers of smoking concludes, "The worst lies are the lies you tell yourself, like smoking isn't that dangerous." To admit the truth, to come to truth, to live the truth is no small thing. Have you ever wondered why it takes a lifetime to come to wisdom, why we aren't born with all the wisdom we need? It would make life so much easier. When Jesus promised us the Spirit, he said, "I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. But when he comes, the Spirit of Truth, he will guide you to all truth" (John 16:12-13). To know ourselves and the truth of who we are can be a painful process, coming to terms with what we do not want to hear. So the Spirit brings us to that wisdom gradually, over the course of a lifetime, lest we run from it.

Paul warns against "immorality and impurity and lust," and each of us at some point in our lives must come to terms with the truth that if we do not channel our sexuality healthfully it will mess up our lives. Paul warns

against "hatred, rivalry, fury, dissensions," and each of us eventually realizes how any of those can ruin relationships and our very lives. Some of us learn such wisdom early in life, some late, yet coming to Truth is a lifelong journey guided by the Spirit.

MAY IS PRO-LIFE MONTH IN SASKATCHEWAN

Euthanasia and assisted suicide are legalized based on the concept of preventing suffering when a person is close to death. In nearly every jurisdiction, after legalizing, the killing has expanded. The reason is that there is only one clear line in the sand: It is always wrong to kill people. Once this line is crossed there is no new clean line. Any new "safeguard" or new "line in the sand" is seen as discriminatory, or impedes one's right to die.

Gather at the Peace Pole in Rotary Park for some quiet conversation, prayers, and songs. If it is sunny, bring a blanket, chair, and guitar, and wear sunscreen. Feel free to bring a prayer or song of peace to share.

* A peace pole is a monument that displays the message "May Peace Prevail on Earth" in the language of the country where it has been placed, and usually additional translations. The message often is referred to as a peace prayer. The original wooden Peace Pole in Rotary Park was erected by the Rotary Clubs of Regina in 2000 and replaced with a metal pole in 2023.

Your City Councillor, Dan LeBlanc will be in attendance. All other City Councillors & Regina Planning Commission members are also invited to come and speak with the public as this decision will affect all communities in Regina.

Understand that your voice is important and you have the right to speak up. <u>Everyone</u> can speak for 5 minutes at the Regina City Planning Commission meeting (Likely May 28th) and Regina City Council meeting (Likely June 12th). These are the final two steps of the process.

Meet your neighbours, share with each other, this is our community to defend. The city needs to hear how this will impact you, what concerns you may have, and how this type of discretionary use approval could affect our community and others to come if approved.
