

His Life as Truth

e are bombarded by many statements professing to be true. Advertisers seek our endorsement, political parties seek our allegiance, and friends seek our agreement. Each purports to offer truth. In the Gospel this week, Pilate asks Jesus whether he is a king. Jesus replies, "You say I am a king. For this...I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice" (John 18:37). What is Jesus' truth?

We tend to go through life taking stands on various issues: how to raise children, what kind of exercise is best, which political approach to endorse, and countless others. Once we decide, we often make that stance one of life's truths and proclaim all others false. Jesus, on the other hand, offers his life as truth, much bigger than our petty truths. His truth stretches us beyond what we already are, more than life issues that change daily. His life's truth declares that meaning is found only by living for others, that loving someone can heal their pain, that wisdom is found in the struggle, that less is more. Jesus' ultimate truth is doing his Father's will. The fact that it is difficult or that we tend not to live it very well makes it no less the truth.

CHRIST THE KING!



On the last Sunday of the liturgical year, Catholics celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King. Established in the 20th century, this feast is designed to give special recognition to the dominion that Christ our Lord has over all aspects of our lives.

World War I was over; the stability of the old social and political orders that embraced royal houses and crowned heads of state was crumbling. Pessimism, a feeling of helplessness, and hatred among nations made the time ripe for the rise of tyrants like Mussolini, Hitler and Stalin.

People gravitated to these tyrants who promised some type of order out of chaos and food on their tables. Pope Pius XI watched as he saw that people were denying Christ in favor of a lifestyle dominated by secularism, material advantage and false hope created by the tyrants In 1925, a jubilee year was celebrated in honor of the 1600th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea (325 AD) where the full divinity of Jesus Christ as God the Son, one in being with God the Father, was affirmed and from whence came the Nicene Creed. Hundreds of thousands of people came to Rome and to the Vatican demonstrating great fervor for their faith.

Pope Pius wanted to acknowledge perpetually the supremacy of Jesus Christ over all men, nations and our earthly allegiances, and that year issued the encyclical *Quas Primas*, which added the feast of "Our Lord Jesus Christ the King" to the annual Church liturgical calendar. He instructed the faithful to use this annual celebration as a time to consecrate themselves to the Sacred Heart and to the living Christ in the Eucharist, and to make reparations for the widespread atheism being practiced in many countries.

In later years Pope Paul VI changed the name of the feast to "Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of All" and moved the date to the last Sunday in the liturgical year, emphasizing the connection between Christ's kingship and His second advent (coming) to judge the world. In addition he raised the feast to the highest rank of celebration on the Church calendar, that of "solemnity".

Monday begins Advent.

QUEBEC defies Canadian law on MAiD directives:

Quebec began accepting advanced requests for assisted suicide on Oct. 30th, and the federal government has pledged not to stand in the province's way. Bill 11, which was approved by the National Assembly of Quebec in June 2023, will allow people with grievous and immediate conditions, Alzheimer's disease in particular, to request a medical killing procedure before their condition deteriorates to a point where they can no longer grant personal consent.

Canada's Minister of Health Mark Holland has declared that Quebec, activating this law, represents a violation of the Criminal Code. Nonetheless, no action will be taken.

The major issue of these directives: How to objectively record clinical manifestations (signs and symptoms) is an emerging key concern as it appears the process creates a substantial avenue for subjective leeway.


Parishioners wishing to make a donation, please bring your baking to the church at 10 am Sat. or before the masses both days.

During his study leave, he visited countless parishes and groups, connecting with priests, pastoral staff, and lay leaders while observing and learning how we "walk together" as a synodal church on mission. Most recently, he participated as a table facilitator at the 2nd Synodal Assembly in Rome in October.

In this series of talks, he shares some of the background leading up to the final gathering in Rome and examines "What did the Spirit speak to the Church through the Synod?" "How far did we progress on the synodal path, and how can we deepen our commitment to walking together in communion, participation, and mission?
