s human beings, we have a sense that by ourselves, we are incomplete. We long to be made whole, to unite with something more. We have glimmers of that wholeness when we fall in love, opening ourselves to another in complete and total surrender. We feel touched by it when we experience great beauty in art, music, and creation. We may also find that wholeness in times of prayer. Yet in all such moments, there is a hint of sadness knowing that it will not last, that we will once again ache for more from life. All such longings are part of the human condition. It is how we have been created from the very beginning, always seeking to be made whole.

The American poet Sara Teasdale wrote in one of her poems that "the heart asks more than life can give." That seems to be true in so many aspects of life. As often as married couples may feel united in their love, they may also expect the other person to fulfill and satisfy that need of wholeness at all times and circumstances. However, that is not possible, and so they may find themselves disappointed. Whether in marriage, friendship, or the bonds of family, love always asks for more than life is able to give. We will always hunger for more, simply because that very hunger flows from God, the only one who will ultimately satisfy it.

CWL NEWS

A big thank you to Jeanine Mann, President of Regina Pro-Life, for coming to speak to us about abortion & euthanasia at this month's regular meeting. She first explained the definition of abortion: The intentional killing – murder - of an innocent human being, and explained that pictures speak louder than words when it comes to showing people the true evils of abortion. They are gruesome but they are reality, and many people are shocked to see this.

Jeanine also spoke about MAiD, the acronym for Medical Assistance in Dying, or euthanasia, how it is anything but a dignified way of dying. She explained that there are three injections. The first puts the person into a coma, the second paralyzes the person, and the third causes the lungs to stop functioning. Doctors explain that the result is something like drowning while the lungs fill up with fluid. The paralitic was added after the person in a coma reacted to the drowning sensation and it was not the peaceful demise they wanted to portray [Alex Shadenburg, Euthanasia Prevention Coalition]. This is not healthcare.

CWL members asked how we could support Pro-Life efforts in Saskatchewan, and the abortion group being led by many enthusiastic young people who've received training on how to discuss such grave issues with others and convert many of them to a pro-life position. Jeanine explained that one could donate to Sask Pro-Life online as well as purchase annual memberships of \$25. This automatically makes you a member also of Regina Pro-Life and of the umbrella organization Campaign Life Coalition.


Go Make Disciples








Food bank usage has increased by 76% in the past 5 years – the highest it has ever been in Canadian history.

World Food Day is marked on 16 October each year. It commemorates the founding of the UN's Food and Agriculture Organization in 1945. Hundreds of events and outreach activities around the world bring together governments, businesses, the public and the media to promote awareness and action for those suffering from hunger.

While the UN marks this day as a reminder that we need to address the problems with our agrifood systems and food insecurity, we can do our part by having a food drive for the Regina Food Bank
